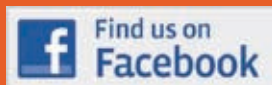

### SELECTION OF SITE AND SEED

The best flower garden/meadow results will be obtained on a project site that is free of weeds, sunlit, level, and well drained. However, project sites rarely have all of these qualities. Wildflowers and wildflower/grass mixtures often grow better in poor quality soil and, can withstand drought conditions. The best seed mixture should be selected based on the unique properties of the project site, including its geographic region, exposure (aspect), slope, availability of moisture, and residential codes. A site that does not receive full sun would require a mix of species suited to partially shady conditions. Roadsides, heavy use or urban areas may require a low-growing mix that has a natural look while maintaining a shorter profile. Other mixes are specially blended to include species that attract birds, hummingbirds, butterflies and bees. Project sites in dry (xeric) areas require species that thrive during times of drought. Special consideration must be taken to ensure that the project site will have adequate moisture during germination and the first growing season. Beauty Beyond Belief's high quality seeds are carefully chosen based on purity and viability standards and include no fillers or inert materials. We create our wildflower mixes for the growing conditions in specific regions based on geography, elevation, rainfall, humidity, and annual temperature range. These mixes include annuals, perennials, native, and introduced species to establish a strong stand and provide an extensive range of bloom time and color. The annuals included in our mixes provide vibrant color, soil stability, shade and guard against weed invasion for the slower growing perennial species. Some annuals may re-seed and return for a few more seasons. The perennials will bloom during the second and following years.

### WHEN TO PLANT

Climate (especially rainfall) should be used to determine the optimum time for seeding the project site. Plant just before the beginning of the rainy season if there will be no supplemental irrigation. For most climates, that time is early spring, after the last frost date. Check with the local Agriculture Extension Office or Natural Resources Conservation Service Office for the average 'last frost date' in the project site area. With supplemental irrigation, wildflowers and mixes can be planted through spring and into early summer up to 9-10 weeks before the first fall frost. Late fall is also a great time to plant, allowing the seeds to overwinter and sprout during the next spring. Seeds may be planted during the winter when the ground is workable and where winter temperatures are consistently below freezing and there would be no chance of early germination. Fall and winter plantings are appropriate for areas that will not receive supplemental irrigation but will rely on the subsequent spring rainy season. In northern climates, take care to plant late enough that the seeds will not germinate during a warm spell and then freeze before the next spring. In mild climates where there is no chance of freezing, plant in the fall before periods of expected rainfall. Your reward will be an early display of blooms the next spring!

### SITE PREPARATION

Preparation and planning will bring hardy and long lasting beauty to your garden. Some stands of short bunch grasses may be left and could provide stabilization for severe slopes, but aggressive choking grasses should be removed. Pull or cut existing weeds. The soil should be only lightly tilled if hard packed; otherwise roughen the surface to promote good seed to soil contact. Tilling the soil deeper may promote the germination of dormant weed seeds present in the topsoil. Soil amendments and fertilizers are probably unnecessary and fertilizer will promote weed growth and compromise bloom time. A low nitrogen fertilizer may be used on excessively poor soils.

### PLANTING METHODS

Follow the suggested planting rates for the wildflower seed species and wildflower mixes that are printed on each package label. For the most even distribution of a mix of variable seed sizes, combine the seed mix with one to two parts of clean dry sand. For small areas, broadcast the seed/s and mix by hand. Use a mechanical spreader for larger areas. Cover the seed only to a depth of ¼ inch or 2-3 times the seed diameter by lightly raking in with a hand rake for small areas. Drag a section of fence or a drag mat behind a tractor for large areas. Avoid covering the seeds too deeply or using more than the recommended seeding rate. When irrigation is possible, soak the area once and maintain consistent moisture for 4 to 6 weeks to ensure the best germination. Seedlings will begin to appear in about 2 weeks. In dry climates or drought conditions, up to ½ inch of supplemental water each week may be required after germination. However, over-watering will encourage weed growth. After the plants become established, the supplemental water can be reduced.

### SITE MAINTENANCE

Maintenance is essential to the creation and propagation of a luxurious wildflower display. Weed control is important for successful wildflower displays, just as it is with traditional landscapes. Quickly growing, vigorous annuals in the seed mix will provide shade for the slow growing perennials and can suppress weed growth. Pull weeds from the project site as soon as they are identified. On larger areas, cut off the weeds before they can produce seed. The project site should fill in the following years as the perennial wildflowers becoming established. Annuals will often re-seed themselves. Continued evaluations will be needed to determine whether additional seeding is needed for bare areas or to achieve the original colorful display of annuals. Some species grow more aggressively than others and manual intervention may be necessary to keep these under control. Mow to a height of 6 inches in the late fall after the seeds have matured and the leaves have turned brown, thrashing the seed pods to scatter the seeds for next year's germination.

### ADDING NATIVES TO YOUR LANDSCAPE

Wildflowers are some of the greatest treasures of nature. Many of these can be grown right outside your back door. There is increasing interest in growing native plants for many reasons. But first of all, what constitutes a native wildflower? Native, or indigenous species are those flowers (forbs) that originate from a defined geographical area and have adapted, through natural selection, to the regional environmental conditions. These spectacular plant species are naturally suited to grow in specific regions, and offer many benefits that introduced or exotic species don't offer. Once established, native wildflowers require less water, fertilizer, and pest control because they have adapted to survive without the supplemental care usually needed by introduced or exotic species. So, how do you go about finding out what is native in your area, and what's not? Your local University Agricultural Extension Office will have a detailed list of native forbs (wildflowers). Another option is to contact your state's native plant society. Next, check the species available in our catalog and our website at [www.bbbseed.com](http://www.bbbseed.com), to find the available natives for your area.

## Mountain Bromegrass

### *Bromus martinatus*



A short-lived, bunchgrass which establishes quickly and can provide quick cover. Does best in higher elevations (up to 10,000') and is native to the inter-mountain west. It is shade tolerant, and has a shallow root system that is well adapted to thin infertile soils. Varieties: Bromar, Garnet.

Seeding Rate: Small Areas: 3-5 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 15-20 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30 lbs. per acre broadcast.

## Indian Ricegrass

### *Achnatherum hymenoides*



A native, cool season, very drought tolerant bunchgrass adapted to well-drained soils. Seed is very slow to germinate and a fall dormant planting is often helpful to allow for stratification. It grows 1-2.5' tall and is very palatable to wildlife and livestock. It makes an excellent reclamation species on dry sites up to 10,000'. Varieties: Nezpar, Paloma, Rimrock.

Seeding Rate: Small Areas: 1-2 lbs./1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 5-7 lbs. per acre drilled; 10-14 lbs. per acre broadcast.

## Slender Wheatgrass

### *Elymus trachycaulus ssp trachycaulus*



A short lived (3-5 yrs.) native bunchgrass with good seedling vigor, rapid establishment, and moderate palatability. A valuable species for mountain revegetation in areas with 10" or more of precipitation. Slender Wheatgrass is shade, salt and alkali tolerant. Grows up to 13,000'. Stems have a characteristic reddish to purplish tinge at the base. Varieties: Pryor, Revenue, San Luis.

Seeding Rate: Small Areas: 3-5 lbs./1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 15-20 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30 lbs. per acre broadcast.

## Western Wheatgrass

### *Pascopyrum smithii*



A long-lived, late maturing native grass, 12-40" tall, widely distributed, winter hardy, strongly rhizomatous with coarse blue-green leaves. Excellent early forage, with a decline in quality as it matures. Protein content is normally higher than other wheatgrasses once cured. Western Wheatgrass is the most aggressive native sod grass available, despite low seedling vigor. Established, it provides excellent soil binding erosion control characteristics. Performs best in areas with over 12" of precipitation. Varieties: Arriba, Barton, Flintlock, Rosana, Walsh.

Seeding Rate: Small Areas: 2-3 lbs./1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 10-15 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30 lbs. per acre broadcast.





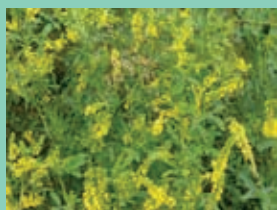
## Cover Crop Mix

### Green Manure

This mix will provide vigorous late season growth to loosen the soil and improve drainage, provide winter erosion control and vital nitrogen, nutrients and organic matter to enrich and build the soil and control weeds. Plant this mix as a cover crop in orchards and vineyards or in rotation with vegetable and field crops. ## GRASSES (WARM SEASON)

### Blue Grama *Bouteloua gracilis*

Blue grama is a short (6"-20"), drought tolerant, warm-season, tufted grass. It is most commonly found on the prairies, but can also be found up to 9,000'. Best adapted to heavy soils, but also does well on sandy to clay soils. Tolerant of saline and alkaline soils. A quick germinator with good winter-hardiness. Widely used for range, pasture, reclamation, and low-maintenance turf. Blue Grama is the Colorado state grass. Varieties: Alma, Bad River, Hachita, Lovington.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 2-3 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.  
Larger Areas: 10-15 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30 lbs. per acre broadcast.



### Buffalograss *Buchloe dactyloides*

A short, 4-6", stoloniferous, dense, sod-forming, palatable native grass common to the prairies. It does not perform well in higher elevations or on sandy sites. Buffalograss sends out above ground stolons which are quite aggressive once mature. Newer turf-type varieties are bred for disease resistance and a deeper green color. Varieties: Bison, Sharps Improved II, Texoca. Turf Type: Bowie, Cody, Sharp Shooter, Topgun.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 3-5 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.  
Larger Areas: 15-20 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30lbs. per acre broadcast.



### Big Bluestem *Andropogon gerardii*

Big Bluestem is an important native warm season plains grass that normally grows 3-8' high. It is recognized for its rapid growth, especially in mid-to-late summer. It is highly palatable with high protein value and produces excellent hay as well as soil erosion control. Its root system can extend up to 12'. It is winter hardy and suited to almost all soil types. Varieties: Bison, Bonilla, Champ, Kaw, Pawnee.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 2-3 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 15-20 lbs. per acre drilled; 20-30 lbs. per acre broadcast.



### Little Bluestem *Schizachyrium scoparium*

Little Bluestem was originally the most abundant of all native grasses. It is a warm season grass that normally grows 1-3' in height. It grows well on deep, shallow, sandy, fine-textured or rocky soils in either uplands or lowlands. It is a favored winter forage in many areas. Leaves become reddish-brown at maturity. Varieties: Aldous, Blaze, Camper, Cimmaron, Pastura.



**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 1-2 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.  
Larger Areas: 7-10 lbs. per acre drilled; 14-20 lbs. per acre broadcast.

### Sideoats Grama *Bouteloua curtipendula*

Sideoats Grama is a native, warm season grass growing 18" - 3' tall. It produces a nutritious, high quality forage that is a favorite of livestock. A good seed producer, it can be found on well-drained soils and even in rocky areas up to 8,000'. It is considered excellent for conservation use and grows well, due to vigorous seedling production. Varieties: Butte, El Reno, Haskell, Killdeer, Niner, Pierre, Premier, Trailway, Vaughn.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 1-2 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. Larger Areas: 8-10 lbs. per acre drilled; 16-20 lbs. per acre broadcast.



### Switchgrass *Panicum virgatum*

Switchgrass grows 3-6' and is used for soil conservation, pastures, hay production, and possibly for biomass fuels. Best adapted to areas of moist soils, but also drought resistant and winter hardy. The earliest maturing of the native warm season grasses; it is readily consumed by livestock. Yields of four tons per acre in one cutting with high amounts of regrowth before frost are common. Varieties: Alamo, Blackwell, Cave-in-Rock, Dacotah, Forestburg, Nebraska 28, Pathfinder, Trailblazer.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 1-2 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.  
Larger Areas: 5-7 lbs. per acre drilled; 10-14 lbs. per acre broadcast.



## CLOVERS:

### Alsike Clover

*Trifolium hybridum*



An introduced legume used as hay, pasture and soil improvement and for honey bee and bumble bee forage. Adapted to a wide range of soil types and will grow well in northern areas and at high elevations. Prefers silty clay loams with consistent moisture (18" plus or irrigation). Not shade tolerant. Usually sown as 25% of a mix with timothy or brome grasses. Pink to white flowers bloom along the length of the stems maturing to a height of 2-4 feet.

**Seeding Rate:** 1/8 lb per 1000 sq ft. or 2-4 lbs. per acre

### Yellow Blossom Sweet Clover

*Melilotus officinalis*



A cool-season biennial legume that is used, as a ground cover, soil builder, cover crop, for erosion control, and in pasture mixtures. It is also a great source of pollen and nectar for honeybees and other native pollinators, drought tolerant and will provide an abundance of organic material for your soil. Prefers well-drained, fertile soils, but will tolerate clay soils. Will bloom the second year and then die. Do not mow during the first year. Spring seeded sweet clover may be plowed under in the fall or winter of the first year to build organic matter into the soil and boost nitrogen levels.

**Seeding Rate:** Small Areas: 1 lb. per 1000 sq. ft.

### White Dutch Clover

*Trifolium repens*



A cool-season perennial legume that is used, as a ground cover, cover crop, for erosion control, and in pasture mixtures. Many homeowners use White Dutch Clover in their lawn seed mix as it is quick to sprout and provides soil stabilization and nutrients for the lawn grasses. It has a creeping growth habit and spreads with rhizomes or "runners" and usually matures between 6 - 8 inches tall. Seeded alone or into an existing grass stand. Prefers well-drained, fertile soils, but will tolerate clay soils. Can be mowed.

**Seeding Rate:** 1/4 - 1/2 lb per 1000 sq ft. or 8-10 lbs per acre

## VETCHES:

### American Vetch

*Vicia americana*



This native legume is a perennial, climbing vine that can grow approximately 1 to 2 feet tall (long). Each plant has a single stem with tendrils that help secure it to structures and stalks of purple flowers. Spreads through rhizomes and reseeds well. Extremely drought tolerant and excellent for sunny and partially shady locations. Use as part of a wildlife seed mix along with native grasses and wildflowers. Often used as an early spring cover crop along with tall grasses such as rye and great for soil improvement and soil stabilizer. Excellent as a grazing and fodder and used as forage for native pollinators. Use as a native alternative for crown vetch for landscaping. Direct sow in the fall. Scarification will decrease germination time. Inoculating seed with the proper correct Rhizobium strain of bacteria aids in nitrogen fixation.

**Seeding Rate:** For cover crop: 15-20 lbs vetch / 50lbs rye or 10 lbs./acre

### Hairy Vetch

*Vicia villosa*



A naturalized vetch from Europe that is a cool season annual or biennial legume with thin branched stems reaching up to 5 feet long and leaves covered in soft wooly fuzz and flower clusters that are violet and white to rose or white. It has a fairly shallow root system and prefers fertile loam soils, but is also productive on sandy or clay soils. Hairy Vetch is used as erosion control, green manure, cover crop, silage or hay and it can provide substantial amounts of nitrogen and dry matter to the soil. Great for spring weed suppression especially mixed with cereal grains such as Winter Rye, Hairy Vetch should be planted in the fall, either broadcasted or drilled. Use 30 lbs of seed per acre for broadcast. Inoculating seed with the proper correct Rhizobium strain of bacteria aids in nitrogen fixation.

**Seeding Rate:** 30-40 lbs./acre, 1 1/4 lbs/1000 sq. ft.

### Utah Sweetvetch

*Hedysarum boreale*



Also called Northern Sweetvetch, this native perennial, cool season, legume has deep taproots which allow the plant to extract deep soil moisture and nutrients, making it drought tolerant and winter hardy. Great for soil stabilization and rangeland seedings. Highly nutritious for livestock and wildlife and an important habitat for sage grouse as well as great forage for honeybees and native pollinators. One of the few native legumes available to use for reclamation, it has great ability to fix nitrogen and improve the quality of the soil. The flowers can be purple, pink or white and are arranged in a loose raceme at the top of woody stems arising from basal leaves. Plant in early spring or, late fall, 1/8 - 3/4 inch deep. Inoculating seed with the proper correct Rhizobium strain of bacteria aids in nitrogen fixation. Germination time: 6-30 days.

**Seeding Rate:** 13 oz./1000 sq. ft., 35 lbs. per acre

## About Heirloom Vegetable Seeds ...

An heirloom vegetable is an open-pollinated variety that has been passed down from generation to generation and, in some cases, can be traced back hundreds of years. There are landrace varieties that developed by adaptation to the natural and cultural environment in which they live and some are a more formal breed which have been bred deliberately to conform to a particular standard

type. These seed lines have been carefully selected to maintain uniformity and consistency for germination. Heirloom seeds become 'heirloom' because they exhibit exceptional traits desired by the gardener. Often this means the plants are more colorful, flavorful, unique, or have great germination and vigor. Often the traits are location dependent, meaning, seeds planted in one garden will not produce in the same manner in another location. Some seeds from vegetables grown for generations in other countries were brought to North America and slowly developed for success in these latitudes and soil types.



We encourage you to try heirloom seeds, to see which have the qualities for your area to become your favorites and to make them into your own

very special seed line. Gardeners have found that as seed is selected and saved over many years, production is increased and the quality is improved, creating plants that will produce best for that locale and will resist diseases and pests of that locale.

Contributing to genetic diversity strengthens the ecosystem. Historically farmers and local gardeners have created and sustained this rich genetic heritage by learning to save their own seeds from varieties that perform best in their own mini-ecosystems. The current trend toward mono crops where only one seed type is used to produce a crop worldwide is eliminating the ability to be able to find genetic variations that will withstand emerging pathogens and climate changes. We encourage you to try heirloom seeds, to see which have the qualities to become your favorites for your own very special seed line.

# HEIRLOOM VEGETABLES — GROW. ENJOY. SHARE.



**Blue Lake Bush Bean**  
**Packet weight - 20gm. about 40 seeds.** This is probably the most widely grown bush green bean. Known for the abundance of smooth, round meaty pods, this snap bean is delicious fresh and also great for canning and freezing. These bush beans are small, self-supporting plants which produce for three weeks or more.



**Contender Bush Bean**  
**Packet weight - 20gm. about 35 seeds.** These garden staples are old-time favorites, great for kids' gardens and known to be one of the first to begin producing. Early harvest begins only 40 days after planting. This is a heavy producer of 6-8" (15-20cm) stringless, meaty pods on 12-18" (30-45cm), sturdy, bush-type plants. Excellent for freezing and canning or fresh right out of the garden.



**Royal Purple Bush Bean**  
**Packet weight - 20gm. about 35 seeds.** This is a great variety for growing in children's gardens, as the deep purple pods are easy to see and watch as they grow. Bush-type, sturdy plants have good vigor in cool soils with tender, meaty and crisp pods. The round, to slightly oval, purple pods turn green while cooking. This open-pollinated variety is excellent for freezing and canning or fresh right out of the garden.



**Pinto Bean**  
**Packet weight - 15gm. about 30 seeds.** The most common bean in the United States, the Pinto is a true heirloom originating in the heart of Spain. Its mottled skin makes it easy to identify and its taste makes it the most popular variety in refried beans. It is one of the official state vegetables of New Mexico.



**Kentucky Wonder Pole Bean**  
**Packet weight - 15gm. about 30 seeds.** This heirloom snap bean features smooth, round meaty pods that are dark green and slightly blue in color. They are delicious eaten fresh and unbeatable for canning and freezing.



**Golden Wax Bean**  
**Packet weight - 15 gm. about 30 seeds.** This Heirloom snap bean produces an abundance of long, yellow pods that are round, meaty and stringless. They are delicious eaten fresh, and unbeatable for canning and freezing.



**Chioggia Beet**  
**Packet weight - 1.5gm. about 150 seeds.** The globular, dark red roots with unique white rings make this Italian-named variety tender and delicious and they can be utilized fresh, canned or pickled. Their reddish-green leaves also make good-tasting greens. Beets are easy to grow and tolerate a wide range of conditions but prefer cool weather.



**Detroit Dark Red Beet**  
**Packet weight - 1.5gm. about 150 seeds.** The globular, dark red roots of this aptly named variety are tender, delicious and can be utilized fresh, canned or pickled. Their reddish-green leaves also make good-tasting greens. Beets are easy to grow and tolerate a wide range of conditions but prefer cool weather.



**Golden Detroit Beet**  
**Packet weight - 1.5gm. about 150 seeds.** These large, orange, round beets are exceptionally sweet and turn deep yellow when cooked. Young beet 'greens' can be used in salads and cooked when mature. Beets are easy to grow, tolerate low fertility and prefer cool conditions to develop the sweetest flavor.



**Calabrese Green Sprouting Broccoli**  
**Packet weight - 1gm. about 250 seeds.** This popular heirloom variety originated in Italy. The cool-weather relative of cabbage is easy to grow and produces a large, compact head. The vitamin-rich head is actually a cluster of tiny flower buds.



**Spring Rapini Broccoli Raab**  
**Packet weight - 1gm. about 250 seeds.** This prized broccoli relative has graceful, loose buds rather than one central bud crown, scattered among tender, tasty leaves. The early first harvest (45 days) will promote further branching for a heavy secondary harvest. The leaves, buds and stems are used for blanching or sautéing. The rich, wild flavor is delightful with olive oil and lemon.



**Romanesco Broccoli**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 250 seeds.** Actually a variation of a cauliflower, but usually listed with broccoli. Multiple, 4-5", light green heads form with florets and stems clustered in ornate twists. The heads have a soft texture and a distinct nutty-cauliflower flavor. A cool season, frost tolerant crop that grows best in the spring or fall when the temperatures are in the 60s F.



**Long Island Brussels Sprouts**  
**Packet weight - 1gm. about 250 seeds.** These plants produce a heavy crop of delicious blue-green sprouts that are extremely cold hardy. Frost improves the flavor. Plant this heirloom in the early spring for a fall crop in the North. The vitamin-rich heads are delicious when used fresh or frozen.



**Baby Choy Cabbage**  
**Packet weight - 1.5 gm. about 350 seeds.** This delightfully mild-flavored cabbage has small clusters of dark green leaf blades and crispy white stalks. Cold hardy and nutritious, this vegetable is easy to grow and good for an early spring or fall crop. The young, crisp stalks are great to eat raw, cooked or marinated.



**Flat Dutch Cabbage**  
**Packet weight - 2gm. about 500 seeds.** This world-renowned variety offers flattened green heads that are split-resistant. It is a vigorous grower and a heavy producer. The plants are easy to grow and should be timed for maturation in cool weather for the best flavor. The vitamin-rich heads are delicious cooked or raw in salads and coleslaw.



**Red Acre Cabbage**  
**Packet weight - 2gm. about 500 seeds.** This popular deep red heirloom variety is a heavy producer of tasty round heads. Vigorous plants are easy to grow, but should be timed so the heads mature in the cool weather for the best flavor. The colorful vitamin-rich heads are delicious cooked or raw in salads and coleslaw.



**Atomic Red Carrot**  
**Packet weight - 500 mg. about 345 seeds.** These organic carrots will add color to your garden and your table! These novel long carrots, when peeled, have pinkish-red roots that turn brilliant red when cooked. The 9" (22 cm) roots are great for steaming, roasting or baking. Lycopene (a pre-cursor to vitamin A), the substance responsible for the red color, has been shown to prevent several types of cancer.



**Cosmic Purple Carrot**  
**Packet weight - 500 mg. about 345 seeds.** These gorgeous organic carrots will brighten up any dish with their eye-catching purple skin and bright orange flesh. With 6-7" tapered roots, these sweet and tender carrots look in their flavor and color even after steaming or sautéing. Add them to your garden for a really fun and healthy snack!



**Danvers 126 Half-long Carrot**  
**Packet weight - 2gm. about 1380 seeds.** The roots of this carrot are uniform and delicious. It is bright orange, with a tender skin and a very sweet taste. Rich in food value, it is an all-purpose variety that stores well and can be used in all stages from tiny to maturity.



**Little Finger Baby Carrot**

**Royal Chantenay Carrot**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 1380 seeds.** Chantenay is a small, sweet variety of carrot with crisp, orange flesh and a tender texture. Hard working farmers have combined modern farming methods with traditional values to revive the Chantenay carrot, a variety that has not been widely available since the 1960's.



**Scarlet Nantes Carrot**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 1380 seeds.** This standard market carrot has a long, tapered shape, a rich reddish-orange color and is sweet and delicious. Rich in food value, it has a variety of uses and stores well.



**Early Snowball Cauliflower**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 260 seeds.** Here is as cool-weather vegetable that is delicious and attractive. It produces uniform, white flower heads that are tightly clustered. This is an early variety that is good in areas with a short growing season.



**Country Gentleman Sweet Corn**

With a thin skin and unique shape they can be eaten just like an apple. Try them sliced, in salads or in cold water as a refreshing drink. Easy to grow and prolific, this heirloom variety is great for areas with short growing seasons.



**Marketmore 76 Cucumber**

**Packet weight - 3gm. about 90 seeds.** This warm-weather vegetable is enjoyed throughout the world. This is one of the finest main-crop slicing varieties. The 8" fruits are delicious fresh or sliced in salads. The plants are vigorous and easy to grow.



**Spacemaster 80 Cucumber**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 35 seeds.** This is a great, dwarf, 18-24 inch, hardy bush-vine bearing large uniform, 7-9 in. cucumbers with great flavor and never bitter. These vines thrive in full sun with heavy yields and are mildew and scab and mosaic resistant.



**Suyo Long Cucumber**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 35 seeds.** These crisp and tender heirloom cucumbers from northern China have ribbed dark-green skin with white spines. An amazing 10-18 inches long and 1.5" diameter; they are almost seedless without any bitterness, and burp-less.



**Black Beauty Eggplant**

**Packet weight - 500 mg. about 100 seeds.** One of the most popular heirloom eggplant varieties, this variety is known for its large, plump, deep purplish-black fruits. The plants grow 2'-3' tall and produce several fruits. The plants are ornamental and can be used in the flower garden and in containers.



**Long Purple Eggplant**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 200 seeds.** The dramatic foliage and colorful fruit of this warm season plant makes this a great vegetable to grow in containers and flower gardens. The 8-10 inch long, club-shaped fruits of this productive plant are deep purple with firm mild flesh.



**Small Gourds Mixture**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 10 seeds.** Tropical vines produce inedible fruit that is brightly, colored, hard-shelled and unusually shaped. The vigorous vines that can spread 10'-20' are often used to beautifully fences, trellises or other areas of the garden. Use the colorful gourds as decorations and for crafts.



**Herb, Wild Arugula**

Deeply lobed leaves provide variety in salads and great flavor to sandwiches and as a garnish. Use the leaves when young and small and re-seed often for continued harvest. This is also a great candidate for container gardens.



**Dark Purple Opal Basil**

**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 150 seeds.** Upright, rounded plants with deep purple leaves and stems and beautiful lilac flowers. Perfect for culinary use in any dish. With an average height of 6'-10", this is a great herb for containers and edible landscapes.



**Herb, Lemon Basil**

**Packet weight - 250mg. about 200 seeds.** This heat loving heirloom, originally native to India, has become an important culinary addition to many cuisines around the world. Intense, citrusy aroma and flavor characterize this basil. Great for containers and more heat tolerant than other basil, use as a fresh herb in salads, fish and vegetable dishes or dry the leaves for later use.



**Herb, Sweet Basil**

**Packet weight - 250mg. about 200 seeds.** This attractive, bushy, plant is an easy-to-grow warm-weather annual. The refreshing, aromatic flavor of the leaves make it a classic ingredient of many Italian dishes. This variety grows well in containers and makes a good addition to flower borders.



**Herb, Garlic Chives**

**Packet weight - 750 mg. about 800 seeds.** An heirloom perennial with star-shaped white flowers, garlic chives can overwinter in mild climates. The dark, green, 16 in. leaves have a distinct but mild, garlic flavor and are flatter and slightly larger than common chives. Use like common chives, fresh from the garden for garnish or flavor, or chop and dry for later use.

**Herb, Standard Chives**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 1100 seeds.** Chives are easy to grow and make a colorful, useful addition to any garden. The slender grass-like leaves have a delicate onion flavor and are used for flavoring many dishes. The attractive violet flowers can be used as a garnish or in dried flower arrangements. Use as an edging or in pots, indoors or out.



**Herb, Coriander/ Cilantro**

**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 140 seeds.** The distinctively flavored leaves of this popular, easy-to-grow annual are known as Cilantro. The seeds of the Coriander are warmly aromatic and richly flavored. The leaves and seeds are used in many salads and dishes throughout the world.



**Herb, Bouquet Dill**

**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 960 seeds.** This popular herb is a very easy-to-grow, tall, attractive annual. The delicate, sweet taste of the fern-like leaves will enhance many culinary dishes. The more strongly flavored seeds are commonly used to flavor baked goods, cheeses and vinegars.



**Herb, Florence Fennel**

**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 60 seeds.** The crispy, mildly sweet, anise-like flavor of this vegetable grown by the ancient Greeks will brighten salads and sandwiches or used to flavor meat dishes and soups. Broad overlapping leaf bases form a swollen, bulb-like structure just above the ground.



**Herb, Oregano Vulgare**

**Packet weight - 200 mg. about 170 seeds.** Prized for its flavorful leaves, this herb has been widely used in several Mediterranean cuisines for hundreds of years as well as in many Mexican dishes. This herb is a perennial and will grow about 10" tall.



**Italian Giant Parsley**

**Packet weight - 500mg. about 180 seeds.** The deep rich flavor of this heirloom from Italy has made it a prized ingredient in a wide variety of dishes. The large, flat, dark green, serrated leaves are more flavorful and sweeter than the curly types. This grows quickly and can stand to be picked often. Use it as a major ingredient in all of your hot dishes, salads and sauces.



**Herb, Broadleaf Sage**

**packet weight - 750 mg. about 180 seeds.** Culinary sage is an easy-to-grow perennial herb and one of the oldest cultivated herbs in the world. This species produces attractive flowers and flavorful gray-green pebbly textured leaves on 10"-30" stems. Use leaves to flavor many dishes.



**Herb, Thyme Vulgare**

**Packet weight - 500 mg. about 1750 seeds.** The leaves and strips of this easy-to-grow, drought tolerant herb are used to flavor food, as an antiseptic, and in essential oils. A warm, pungent spice that can be used fresh or dried in many dishes, marinades, and sauces, it is a low, spreading, woody perennial.



**Lacinato Kale**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 250 seeds.** The large leaves of this ancient Italian heirloom are meaty in texture and become even sweeter with the first frosts. Unusual blue-green leaves make a striking addition to an edible landscape. Use the young leaves for salads and the mature leaves sautéed or steamed.



**Lacinato Kale, Organic**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 250 seeds.** Large blue-green leaves of this organic, heirloom kale are meaty in texture and become even sweeter with the first frosts. Use the young leaves for salads and the mature leaves sautéed or steamed. This makes a great winter microgreen.



**Red Russian Kale**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 250 seeds.** Tender and colorful, this medium-tall variety has blue-green leaves with reddish-purple veins and stems. Use the baby leaves fresh for salads and the full sized leaves sautéed or steamed. The leaf color deepens with colder weather and makes a beautiful fall landscape planting.



**Red Russian Kale, Organic**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 250 seeds.** A medium-tall organic variety of kale has blue green leaves with wavy edges and reddish-purple veins and stems. Use the baby leaves fresh for salads and the full sized leaves sautéed or steamed. Beautiful for fall landscape planting. Makes a great winter microgreen.



**American Flag Leek**

**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 100 seeds.** These ancient heirlooms are hardy, 15-18" plants that can overwinter in many growing areas with uniform, 1.5-2" thick stalks. The blue-green leaves, and long, thick, well blanched, white stalks are great for home gardens and market. They grow very quickly and the mild delicate onion flavor will enhance soups, stews, and salads.



**Speckles Bibb Lettuce**

**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 200 seeds.** This is an old Amish heirloom butterhead type that has consistently great performance and matures quickly. Fluffy, apple-green leaves are uniquely flecked with red-maroon polka dots and form a tight bibb-like head with a blanched heart. The sweet buttery flavor is a great addition to your salad bowl or on sandwiches.



**Summer Bibb Lettuce**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This butterhead type of lettuce is prized for the heavy compact heads, superb flavor and heat resistance. The outer leaves blanch to a light color with a buttery texture and rich flavor. The outer leaves are crisp and juicy. This is a good choice for production in early summer and ideal for containers.



**Gourmet Salad Blend Lettuces**

**Packet weight - 1 g. about 790 seeds.** Five lettuce varieties that are known for their flavorful qualities, custom blended together, creating a colorful and textural mixture. These are all recommended by local market gardeners and chefs. Includes: Dark Lolla Rossa, Silvia, Flame, Buttercrunch and Vivian.



**Heirloom Blend Lettuces**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This mix of heirloom lettuce varieties has been chosen to provide an assortment of delightful flavors, colors and textures, making it easy to grow your own salad mixture. Mix includes: Black Seeded Simpson, Oakleaf, Red and Green Salad Bowl, and Prizehead lettuces.



**Black Seeded Simpson Lettuce**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This mix of heirloom lettuce variety is quick to mature producing bright green, frilly leaves that are sweet and tender. Plant the seed in the cool seasons for the sweetest flavor. This variety is slow to bolt, and because it matures quickly it can be grown later in the spring than most lettuces.



**Red Deer Tongue Leaf Lettuce**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This loose-leaf lettuce variety has tender, triangular leaves with straight edges that are red-tinted. The young plants form a loose rosette with a mild flavor. A sturdy plant and heavy producer it will tolerate warmer temperatures, making it a good candidate for season-long harvests.



**Red Oak Leaf Lettuce**

**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This loose leaf lettuce variety has tender, oak-shaped leaves that have crunchy stems and is quick to mature to a deep burgundy color. Plant the seed in the cool seasons and in full sun for the sweetest flavor and deepest color.

**Tango Leaf Lettuce**  
**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 200 seeds.** A gourmet treat for the salad bowl, these uniformly attractive plants have tight erect rosettes of curly dark green leaves that resemble endive in appearance. This lettuce is vitamin rich, tender with a tangy flavor.



**Dark Green Romaine Lettuce**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** This unique heirloom lettuce produces cylindrical, upright heads. The long, cupped leaves are medium to dark green, thick and crisp and have a sweet, mild flavor. This variety is highly prized and considered a gourmet delight. For the best flavor and development, plant the crops to mature during cool weather.



**Freckles Romaine Lettuce**  
**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 200 seeds.** This heirloom is a classic romaine with beautiful, tender, glossy, apple-green leaves splashed with maroon-red. A heat and sun tolerant, long standing variety that resembles Speckles Butterhead but with more substantial leaves that have a crisp, slightly bitter flavor.



**Green Flesh Honeydew Melon**  
**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 90 seeds.** The delicious fruits of this old-world heirloom grow to slightly over 5" across and weigh up to 7-1/2 lbs. The thick juicy flesh is light green and very sweet and the seed cavity is small. The vines are disease resistant.



**Hearts of Gold Cantaloupe**  
**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 90 seeds.** True to its name, this cantaloupe offers golden-colored flesh that is sweet and juicy. The melons are large and round, with a thin rind. These fragrant fruits need heat and a longer growing season.



**Minnesota Midget Muskmelon**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 45 seeds.** Great for short growing seasons! Compact, 3 ft. vines bear large crops of 4 in. melons. Thick, meaty, pale-yellow flesh has a unique flavor with high sugar content. Edible to the rind, high quality fruits have fine dense netting are early flowering and resistant to Fusarium Wilt.



**Mesclun Greens Blend**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 790 seeds.** The word mesclun comes from the French mescl, meaning "to mix". Each of the heirloom varieties included in this mix have been chosen to provide an assortment of delightful flavors, colors and textures and includes: Arugula, Red Giant and Mizuna Mustards, Tatsoi and Tokyo Bekana Chinese cabbages.



**Micro Greens Mix**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 200 seeds.** This mix includes: Purple Vienna Kohlrabi, Bulls Blood Beet, Mizuna Mustard, China Rose Radish, Pepper Cress. All have been chosen to provide an assortment of flavors, colors and texture.



**Mizuna Mustard**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 300 seeds.** This hardy, cold tolerant, vigorous grower forms mounds of long serrated leaves that are mildly peppery-spicy. The young leaves are a delightful addition to salad mixtures and the mature leaves are great for braising. The decorative foliage is a great candidate for the edible landscape.



**Clemson Spineless Okra**  
**Packet weight - 2.5 gm. about 50 seeds.** This heirloom Okra is a classic, easy-to-grow garden favorite. It is a wonderfully ornamental plant that produces crunchy edible pods that are eaten fried, roasted, steamed, pickled or added to soups and curries and often used as a thickener. The 4-6" (12-18 cm) plants love warm temperatures and have velvety foliage and beautiful, hibiscus-like flowers.



**Tokyo Long White Bunching Onion**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 240 seeds.** This Japanese heirloom is a sweet, mild bunching variety with long, uniform, single stem stalks. Use the stems and tops of this non-bulbing onion for salads and as a garnish or topping. This variety does well in most areas and can be planted for early summer and fall harvests. These are so easy to grow and are great for small gardens and containers.



**Green Arrow Shelling Pea**  
**Packet weight - 15 gm. about 60 seeds.** This old-time English garden pea has been a cool weather favorite for generations. The small and tender immature pods are great for eating fresh, unshelled or cooked. The plentiful pods are bursting with 8-11 peas when mature and great for shelling.



**Dwarf Gray Sugar Snap Pea**  
**Packet weight - 15 gm. about 60 seeds.** These peas are a famous generation of garden pea. This variety is the earliest of all snap peas. The vines are dwarf, compact and yield a bonanza of 2-3" pods. Crisp, crunchy and delicious, the whole pods are eaten when they are plump and round. Serve raw or cooked. They are also good for freezing.



**Oregon Sugar Pod II Snap Pea**  
**Packet weight - 15 gm. about 60 seeds.** This edible-pod, bush snap pea variety has tender, crisp, sweet, 4" long pods. Ideal for stir-fry dishes and salads and great for freezing.



**Sugar Ann Snap Pea**  
**Packet weight - 10 gm. about 40 seeds.** Extra sweet pods and even 14 days earlier than Sugar Snap variety, these 24-30" vines need no trellising or support. The pods are medium green, 2.5-3 inch round blunt pods with 7 peas. The extra sweet pods are great to eat right off of the vine and freeze well.



**California Wonder Pepper**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 130 seeds.** This variety produces large, stuffing-size peppers that can be harvested when they are green or later as they mature to red. At both stages the flavor is sweet and mild, and the texture is crisp and crunchy. This is also a great candidate for the container garden.



**Golden Calwonder Pepper**  
**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 35 seeds.** A highly productive pepper variety that produces blocky four-lobed, 4-6" peppers which ripen to a beautiful deep yellow color. The sweet and mild, thick-walled peppers are crisp and crunchy and great served raw with dip, in salads, salsas, fried or stuffed. These peppers also grow well in containers.



**Orange Sun Pepper**  
**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 35 seeds.** An heirloom variety that produces an abundance of blocky, three to four-lobed, 4-6" long, peppers that ripen to a beautiful deep orange color. The spicy-sweet flavor and thick crisp texture is great for roasting, grilling, serving raw with dip, in salads, salsas, fried or stuffed. These peppers also grow well in containers.



**Sweet Chocolate Pepper**  
**Packet weight - 250 mg. about 35 seeds.** These very sweet, medium sized, tomato shaped, peppers are great for northern gardens. Chocolate-red, three or four-lobed fruits are early to mature. Rare seed.



**Anaheim Pepper**  
**Packet weight - 1 gm. about 130 seeds.** This is a hardy, long-bearing, medium-hot chili pepper. The tall bushy plants grow best in warm weather, producing a multitude of 6-10" (15-25 cm) tapered fruits with medium-thick flesh and a pungent aroma. Use these peppers fresh, dried, canned, pickled or strung into decorative ristras. The color varies from deep green to bright red when fully ripe.

**Early Jalapeno Pepper**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 130 seeds.** Jalapenos are noted for their zesty, hot flavor widely used in Mexican cuisine. The blunt-ended, thick-walled fruits grow about 3" long and have a deep green color maturing to red. These are excellent for pickling, and for adding zest to many dishes. These can also be dried for decorations.



**Orange Habanero Pepper**

**Packet weight - 500 mg. about 65 seeds.** Habaneros are an exceptionally hot pepper; about 50 times hotter than the Jalapeno pepper. Prolific plants grow 36" tall and produce light green tapered fruits with wrinkled skins that mature to bright orange-red. The fruity flavor and floral aroma is highly prized when used sparingly to add zest to dishes.



**Serrano Pepper**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 130 seeds.** The long, finger-shaped fruits are medium spicy hot and can be used when they are green or red in color. Widely used in Spanish-American cooking, the fruits are excellent for pickling and for adding zest to many dishes.



**Big Max Pumpkin**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 6 seeds.** This immense variety is often a prizewinner in pumpkin contests. When properly nurtured, an individual fruit can exceed 100 pounds. The fruits have a pink-orange, ribbed skin. The flesh is yellow-orange, intensely flavored and fine for pies and cooking. The seeds make a delicious and nutritious snack.



**Cinderella Pumpkin**

**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 16 seeds.** This antique French heirloom, popular in the 1800's has slightly flattened, shiny red-orange fruits with narrow deep ribbed sections and rough bumpy skin. These can grow up to 40 lbs. and are beautiful and decorative. The flesh is flavorful and great for cooking and pies. The large seeds are good for toasting.



**Connecticut Field Pumpkin**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 15 seeds.** This is an ideal multi-use pumpkin for Jack O'Lanterns and for consumption. Each fruit averages about 12-18 lbs. and has smooth firm, bright orange skin. The richly flavored flesh is ideal for pies and breads. The seeds make a delicious and nutritious snack.



**Jack B Little Pumpkin**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 10 seeds.** This popular variety produces petite pumpkins about 3" across and 2" high. Each plant yields 6-8 fruits. Though edible, Jack B Little is used mainly for crafts, and decorations. These can be stored for up to 12 months when properly cured.



**Jack O'Lantern Pumpkin**

**Packet weight - 1gm. about 8 seeds.** This is a perfect pumpkin for carving and cooking. Each fruit averages about 20 lbs. The skin is a deep rich orange and the shape is a slightly flattened sphere which will keep the Jack O'Lantern upright. The richly flavored flesh is ideal for pies and breads. Roast the seeds for a delicious snack.



**Cherry Belle Radish**

**Packet weight - 8gm. about 640 seeds.** Heirloom radishes are easy to grow, tasty, colorful and ready for harvest in just a few weeks. They are best if harvested during cool weather. This variety has scarlet skin and crisp, white flesh. At full size the roots are round and about 1/4" in diameter. This is a very early maturing variety and grows well in containers.



**French Breakfast Radish**

**Packet weight - 2 gm. about 160 seeds.** This early radish has been grown since the 1880's. The beautiful rose-scarlet roots are oblong with a blunt white tip, 2" long, 3/4" diam. and a small tender taproot. The crisp white flesh has a distinct mildly pungent flavor. This is a top quality old-fashioned favorite.



**White Icicle Radish**

**Packet weight - 5gm. About 400 seeds.** This variety has a long tapered, icicle shaped root about 5" long. The crisp, mild root has white skin and white flesh. Radishes are easy to grow and ready for harvest in just a few weeks. These grow well in containers.



**Bloomsdale Spinach**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 180 seeds.** Few leafy greens top heirloom spinach for easy-to-grow productiveness and nutrition. This fast-growing variety produces thick, oversized leaves with a superb flavor. Plants resist tip burn and downy mildew. This variety thrives in cool weather.



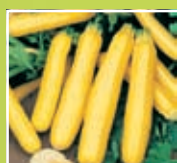
**Nobel Giant Spinach**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 180 seeds.** This great heirloom forms large spreading plants that are slow to bolt. Huge, thick, pointed leaves are smooth and dark-green with round tips. The heavy yields will ensure that you will have enough to eat fresh from the garden and more for freezing and canning.



**Black Beauty Zucchini Summer Squash**

**Packet weight - 3gm. about 25 seeds.** The straight, slender fruits of this summer-type squash have firm, flavorful, nearly white flesh. The plants are easy to grow, mature quickly and produce many fruits. Use them raw or cooked and they freeze well when sliced or cubed.



**Early Straightneck Summer Squash**

**Packet weight - 3gm. about 25 seeds.** This summer-type squash is easy to grow and matures quickly. It produces an abundance of low-calorie, versatile fruits. This easy-to-pick variety is straight and slender with tender pale yellow skin and creamy yellow flesh. Use this squash raw or cooked and it freezes well when sliced or cubed.



**Jaune et Verte Summer Squash**

**Packet weight - 3 gm. about 25 seeds.** This French heirloom has beautiful scalloped, slightly flattened fruits that are a lovely creamy-yellow (jaune) with contrasting deep green (verte) radial streaks when fully mature. Eat when young and small for the sweetest and most tender flesh. Save the mature fruits to bake or for beautiful fall decorations.



**Yellow Crookneck Summer Squash**

**Packet weight - 2gm. about 16 seeds.** A classic summer squash variety that will produce all season long. The bright yellow squash with a narrow curved neck is flavorful and tender. Use when 4-6" long and the skin is tender. Great to use fried, steamed or baked.



**Baby Green Hubbard Winter Squash**

**Packet weight - 3gm. about 25 seeds.** This variety is a winter or storage squash that produces fruit with yellow-orange flesh that is fine grained and very flavorful. These teardrop shaped squash are about 12" long and 10" across with tapered ends and hard, bumpy, deep green skin. These can be stored for many months.



**Red Kuri Winter Squash**

**Packet weight - 3 gm. about 25 seeds.** This Japanese winter or storage squash will produce teardrop-shaped fruits about 12" (30 cm) long and 10" (25 cm) across with tapered ends. The bumpy skin is hard and a deep reddish-orange. The flesh inside is orange-yellow and finely grained and very flavorful. The high yielding, 10 lb fruits are excellent to bake, steam or microwave. Stores well.



**Table Queen Acorn Squash**

**Packet weight - 4gm. about 30 seeds.** This is one of the most popular and flavorful of the winter or storage squashes. The dark-green skinned fruits are deeply ribbed and grow about 5" long and 4" in diameter. The orange flesh is sweet, firm and excellent alone or in dishes. This is a good storage variety.

**Waltham Butternut Winter Squash**  
**Packet weight – 3 gm. about 25 seeds.**

This winter or storage squash is very popular with an abundance of sweet nutty flesh. The oblong, tan-skinned fruits grow about 8-12" long and are larger at one end. The seed cavity is small. The fruit is excellent when roasted, steamed, or cooked in the microwave for use in soups, breads, muffins and casseroles. This squash will store extremely well.



**Vegetable Spaghetti Winter Squash**  
**Packet weight – 3 gm. about 25 seeds.**

This heirloom winter squash with vigorous, spreading vines and rounded cylindrical buff-tan fruits was brought from Manchuria. Each vine produces 5-7, 8-12" long and 5-6" around fruits per plant that will keep up to six months. Great to boil whole or bake, then peel the flesh out in strands of crisp, low calorie spaghetti-like strands.



**Rainbow Swiss Chard**

**Packet weight – 100 mg. about 10 seeds.** This is a great blend of heirloom varieties with glossy, crinkly leaves that are thick and tender. The flavor is full and slightly salty with the typical bitter bite of this type of cooking greens, similar to spinach. A rainbow blend of varieties with vibrant leaf and stem colors have been combined in this packet. Chard is an easy-to-grow, attractive plant that also grows well in containers.



**Tomatillo Verde**

**Packet weight – 250 mg. about 70 seeds.** An ancient vegetable with small, plump, firm fruits with a paper-like cellulose husk covering that resemble small green lanterns that hang downward on bushy annual plants. The tart, lemony flavor is perfect for marinades, fresh salads and simmered into sauces and soups. Indeterminate, sprawling plants grow 3-4 ft. tall and wide.



**Amish Paste Tomato**

**Packet weight – 125 mg. about 38 seeds.** These oval or acorn shaped, 8-12 oz. deep red fruits have thick flesh and very few seeds. An indeterminate variety that is an Amish heirloom originally from Lancaster, PA, and one of Slow Food USA's "Ark of Taste" varieties. Great to use for canning and sauces as well as eating right off the vine.



**Aunt Ruby's German Green Tomato**

**Packet weight – 125 mg. about 38 seeds.** This is an heirloom beefsteak variety with indeterminate habit that ripens to a pale green with a hint of yellow and a pink blush that runs to the interior. These 5" diameter tomatoes have a juicy, slightly spicy, fruity flavor.



**Beefsteak Tomato**

**Packet weight – 1 gm. about 300 seeds.** This popular world-famous variety produces lots of large fruit. The flesh is firm, meaty with an excellent flavor that is perfect for salads, juice, canning, relishes and cooking.



**Black Krim Tomato**

**Packet weight – 125 mg. about 38 seeds.** These luscious tomatoes will complete the summer garden. This heavy producer is a widely adapted, all-purpose heirloom from the Black Sea area of Russia with dark reddish-purple, almost black, fruit with the perfect blend of acid and sugar. Black Krim is a medium-sized plant of indeterminate habit and an excellent choice for salads, juices, canning, relishes, and cooking.



**Cherokee Purple Tomato**

**Packet weight – 125 mg. about 38 seeds.** This is a recently-popular heirloom that is known for its multiple disease tolerance and wide adaptability. It is the perfect home garden tomato with abundant purple/red, beefsteak shaped fruits that are firm with dark flesh and very flavorful. This is a large plant with an indeterminate habit that will provide a longer fruit production.



**Heirloom Tomato Blend**

**Red Cherry Tomato**

**Red Pear Tomato**

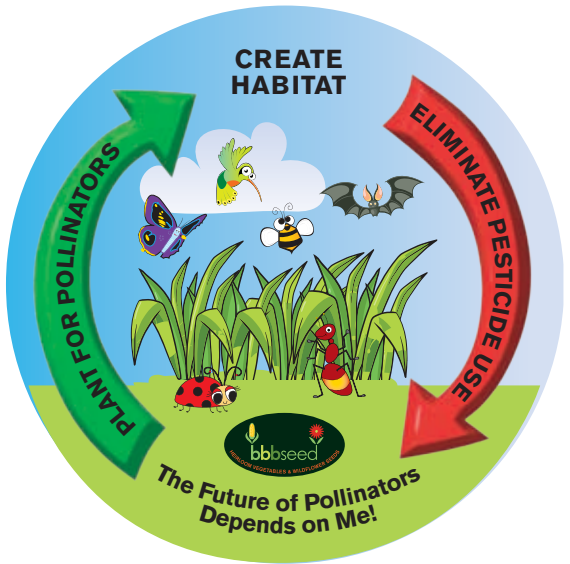


**Golden Midget Watermelon**
